

Risk of kidney disease doubled with use of fluoroquinolone antibiotics

The risk of acute kidney disease is doubled for people taking oral fluoroquinolone antibiotics, according to a study of published in *CMAJ* (*Canadian Medical Association Journal*).

Fluoroquinolones, including ciprofloxacin, levofloxacin and moxifloxacin, are common broadspectrum antibiotics most often used to treat respiratory and urogenital infections. Case reports have indicated acute kidney injury with use, and prescription labels carry a warning of kidney failure . However, when oral fluoroquinolones are prescribed in clinical practice, kidney injury is usually not considered.

Researchers from the US and Canada undertook a study to determine the risk of acute kidney injury with the use of oral fluoroquinolones for adult men 40
