

Derms seek minimally invasive rx mostly from other derms

(HealthDay)—A majority of female dermatologists undergo minimally

invasive cosmetic procedures (MICPs), and most choose other dermatologists to perform the procedures, according to a study published online June 20 in the *Journal of Cosmetic Dermatology*.

Hamza Yildiz, M.D., from the Eskisehir Military Hospital in Turkey, and colleagues conducted a cross-sectional descriptive study among 318 [dermatologists](#) (73.3 percent female). The participants completed an 11-item questionnaire to examine use of MICP.

The researchers found that 56 percent of the dermatologists underwent MICPs (66.1 percent among females and 28.2 percent among males; P "The data in this survey demonstrated that dermatologist was the most preferred physician by dermatologists who had MICPs," the authors write. "The reason for this high rate may be due to immediate and easy accessibility to the dermatologists for the procedures and trust [in] the dermatologists. Experience was the most important reason for choosing a physician."
