

Treated diabetic retinopathy rare in children with T1DM

(HealthDay)—Treated diabetic retinopathy (DR) is extremely rare among children with type 1 diabetes, according to research published online Oct. 7 in *Diabetes Care*.

Giovanna Beauchamp, M.D., from the University of Florida in Gainesville, and <u>colleagues</u> used data from the T1D Exchange Clinic Registry to examine how often treatable DR was reported among <u>young</u> <u>people</u>. Information was collected about treatment for DR for 12,535 patients aged
