

Supratentorial ICH outcomes better in young blacks, hispanics

(HealthDay)—For young adults with supratentorial intracerebral hemorrhage (ICH), functional outcomes are improved with black and Hispanic versus white race/ethnicity, according to a study published online Jan. 22 in *Neurology*.

Laura C. Miyares, from the Yale School of Medicine in New Haven, Connecticut, and colleagues examined predictors of functional outcome in <u>young patients</u> enrolled in the Ethnic/Racial Variations in Intracerebral Hemorrhage prospective multicenter study, including non-Hispanic white, non-Hispanic black, and Hispanic adults. A subset of 418 participants aged
